The agreement, formally signed by the Secretaries of the Army and Navy on March 20, 1950 still has relevance today as the PEO STRI and NAWCTSD continue to collaborate on training and simulation systems that train our service members. The early simulation systems (or training devices, as they were referred to in the early years) were rudimentary, but they were the catalysts that set in motion the very sophisticated systems we have today. The systems touch every Soldier, Sailor, Airman and Marine - and every member of the military who deploys trains on a simulation/training system that resulted from this early agreement.

For Central Florida, the 60-year agreement has strong economic impacts, resulting in thousands of jobs. In just the last ten years, the military simulation commands' annual contract awards have increased to well over \$3 billion. Over the last 20 years, the Team Orlando government partners have grown to include Marine Corps; Air Force, Coast Guard; Office of the Secretary of Defense, Joint Advanced Distributed Learning Co-Lab; the Defense Acquisition University; Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, ...60 years of cooperation - a catalyst for strong partnership - good jobs - and most importantly training systems that are saving lives and bringing America's sons and daughters home from war.

Spotlight of the Month Kristy Murray



Dr. Kristy Murray is the director of the Advanced Distributed Learning Co-Laboratories and oversees the operations at the Co-lab in Alexandria, VA. Her primary mission is to support and assist the federal government and Services as they integrate ADL standards and emerging technologies into their programs. In support of this mission, the ADL Initiative conducts outreach,

research, and prototype development.
